RESPECTIVE FUNCTIONS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS AND PRINCIPAL IN RELATION TO ADMISSIONS

The criteria below have been determined by the Board of Governors. In the event of the criteria having to be applied, the Principal will consider all applications in the first instance and final decisions regarding admission will be taken by the Board of Governors or a sub-committee thereof, established for the purpose.

If there are more applicants than places then the following criteria will be applied in the order set down below. Priority in the application of these criteria will be given to children resident in Northern Ireland at the time of their proposed admission.

The Board of Governors reserves the right to require such supplementary evidence as it may determine to support or verify information on any Application Form/Transfer Form.

The provision of false or incorrect information or the failure to provide information within the deadlines set by post-primary schools can result in the withdrawal of a place and the inability to offer a place on the part of any school nominated on the applicant's Application Form/Transfer Form.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA 2023

1 Children who are transferring from the school's traditional contributory primary schools,

If the school's admission number is exceeded at this stage, pupils who have satisfied criterion 1 will be allocated to the sub-groups listed below and given priority in the order shown.

- 2 Sibling - Children who, at the date of their application, have a child of the family currently enrolled at the school.
- 3 Children who, at the date of their application, are the eldest child of the family to be eligible to apply for admission to the school. *
- 4 First application received from a family with no previous connection with the school.
- 5 Other pupils.

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PARENT(S)/GUARDIAN(S) TO PROVIDE ALL THE RELEVANT INFORMATION ON THE APPLICATION FORM/TRANSFER FORM.

The same criteria are applied to those seeking admission to year 8 after the beginning of the school year.

In the event of over-subscription in the last criterion children will be selected for admission on the basis of initial letter(s) of surname (as entered on Birth Certificate) in the order set out below:

S O Y P V I M A U C N J F K L Mac X Q G R Z E H W T Mc D B O'

The order was determined by a randomised selection.

In the event of surnames beginning with the same letter the subsequent letters of the surnames will be used in alphabetical order. In the event of two identical surnames the alphabetical order of the initials of the forenames will be used.

Total admissions include children who were admitted to the school with a statement of special educational need.

ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR ENTRY TO YEARS 9 – 12

Pupils will be considered for enrolment providing that their admission:

- (a) Would not cause the school to exceed its enrolment number as determined by the Department of Education;
- (b) Would not prejudice, in the opinion of the Board of Governors, efficient use of resources.

If at the time of application there are more applicants than places available in a particular year group then the admission criteria as for Year 8 will be applied in order to select pupils.

* The Board of Governors have decided that this criterion will cover where a family has not, in the opinion of the Board of Governors, had the opportunity to have an elder child already and currently enrolled, e.g., in cases where a child is more than 7 years younger than their next sibling. It will also include cases where a family has moved residence; or cases where an older sibling cannot attend mainstream school, for example attends a special school.
